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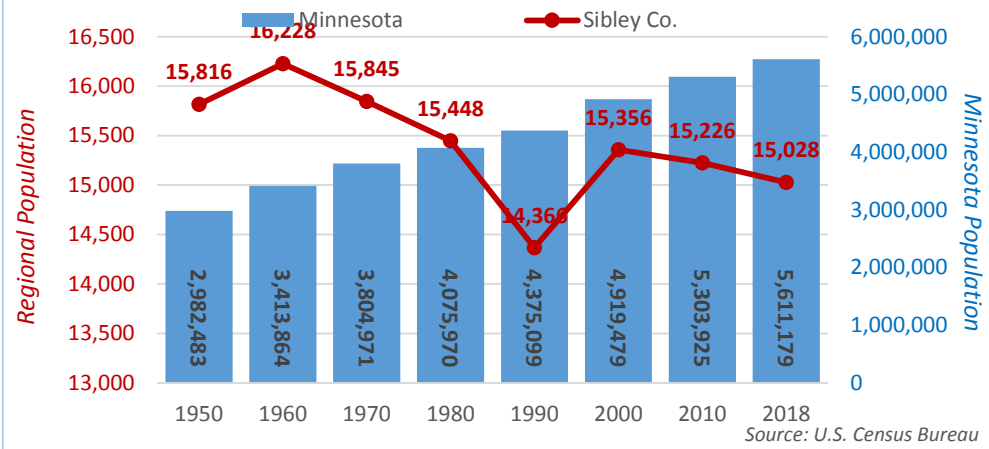

Figure 1. Population Change, 1950-2018



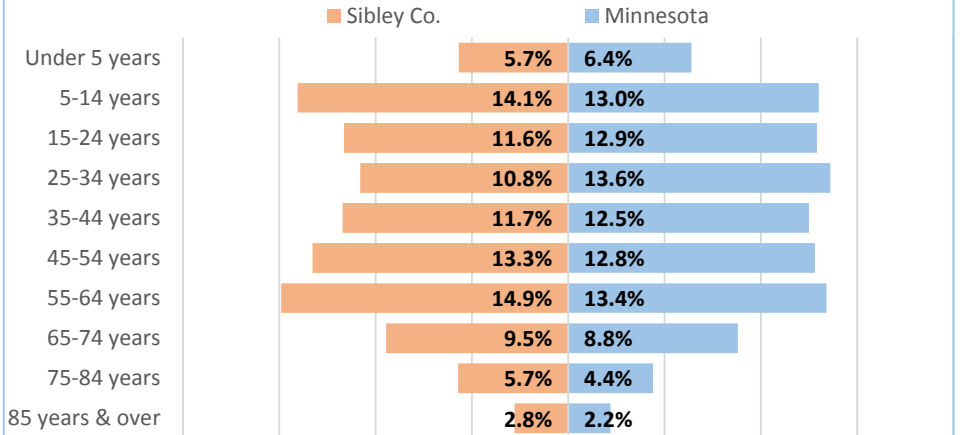

Figure 2. Percentage of Population by Age Group, 2017

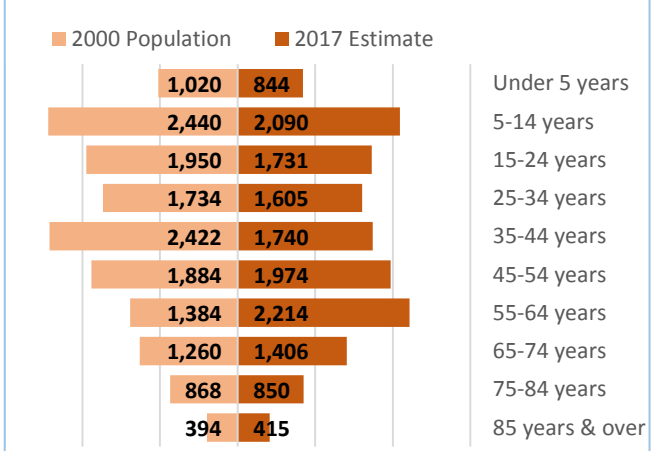

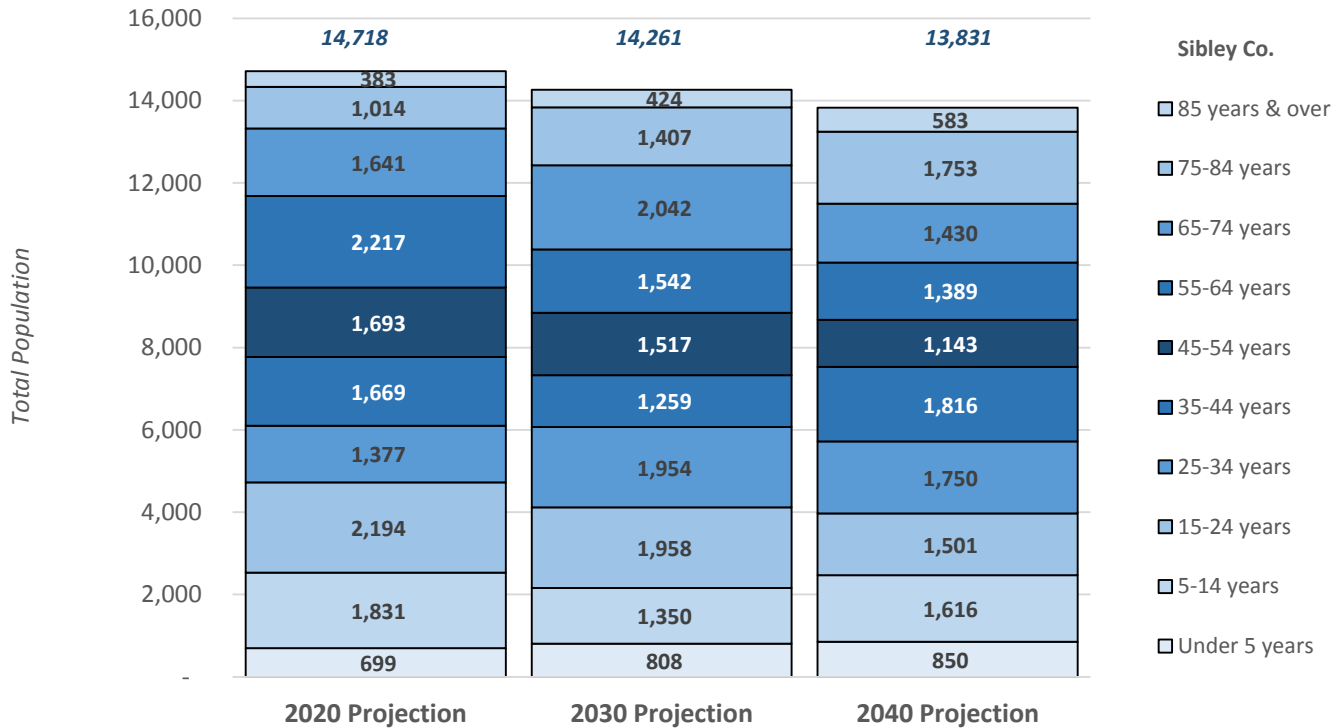

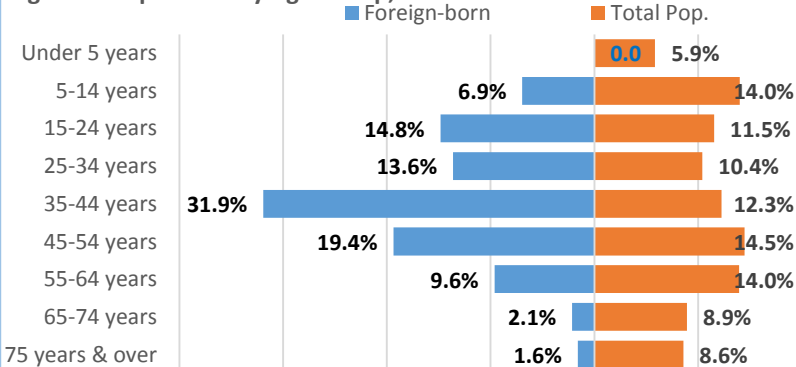

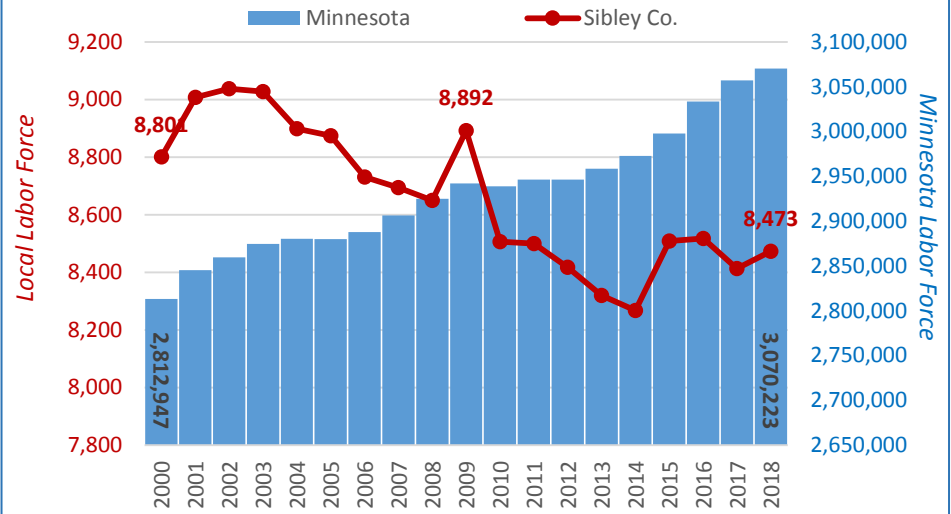

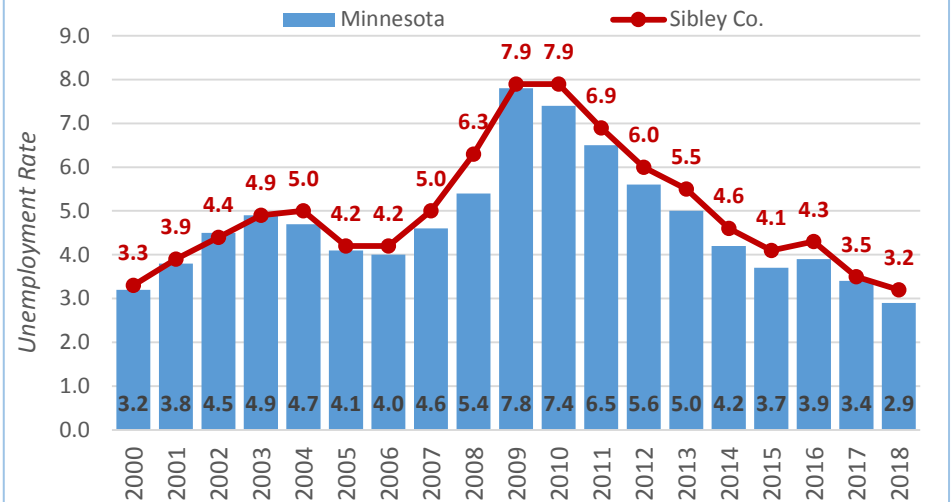

Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates, 2000-2018



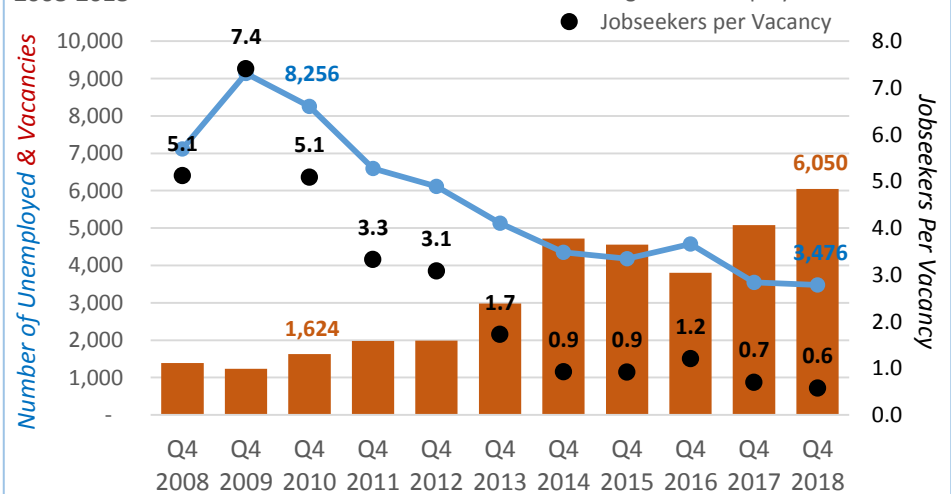

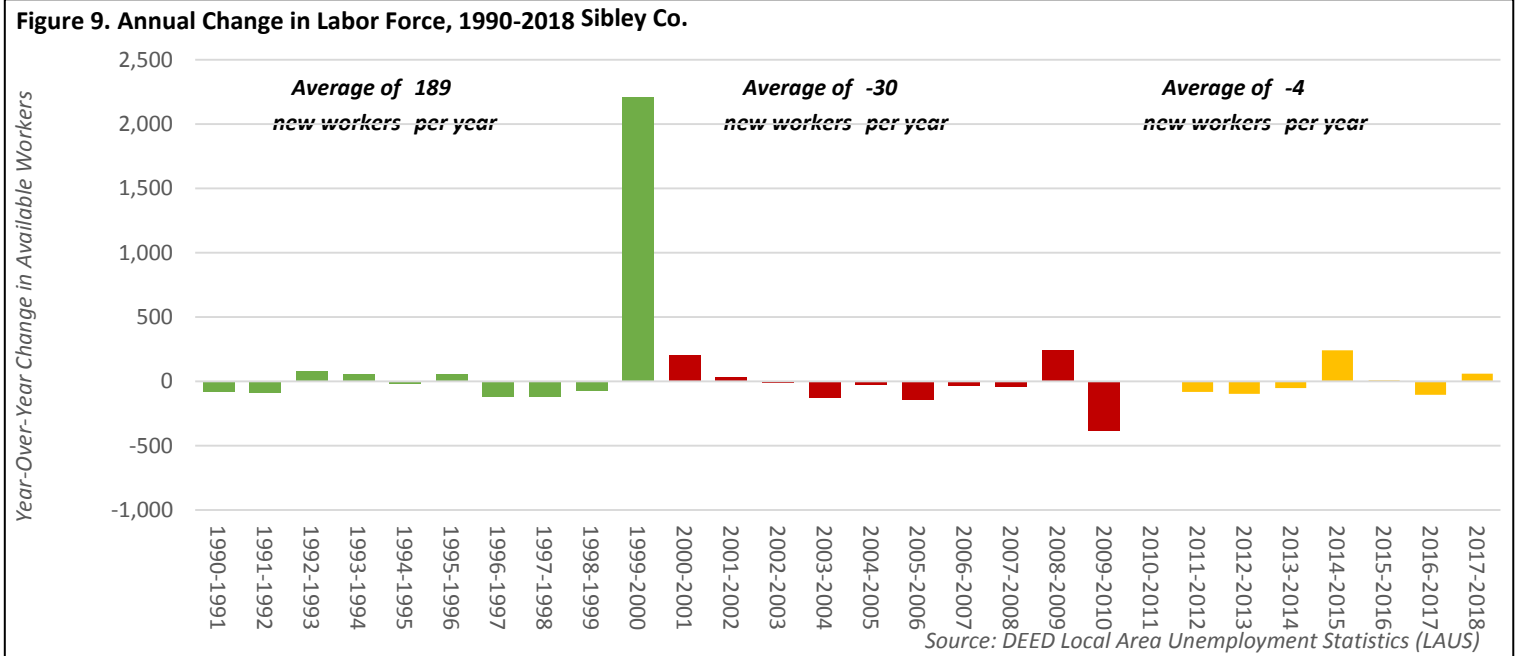
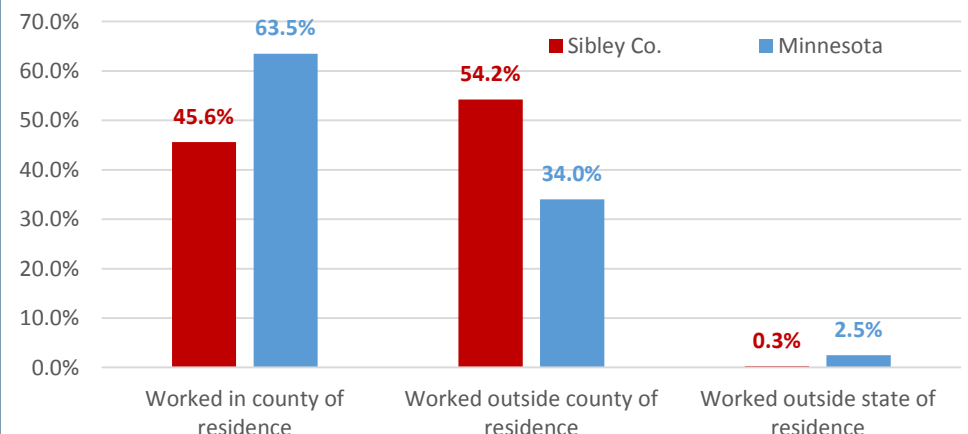

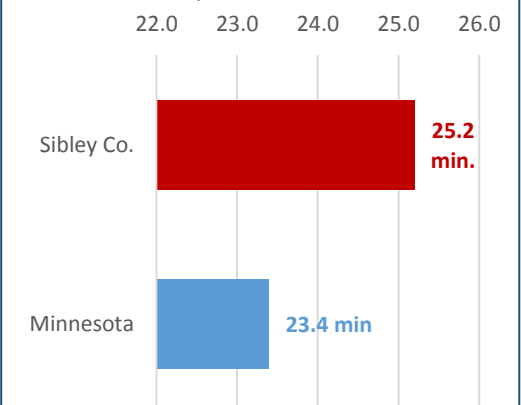

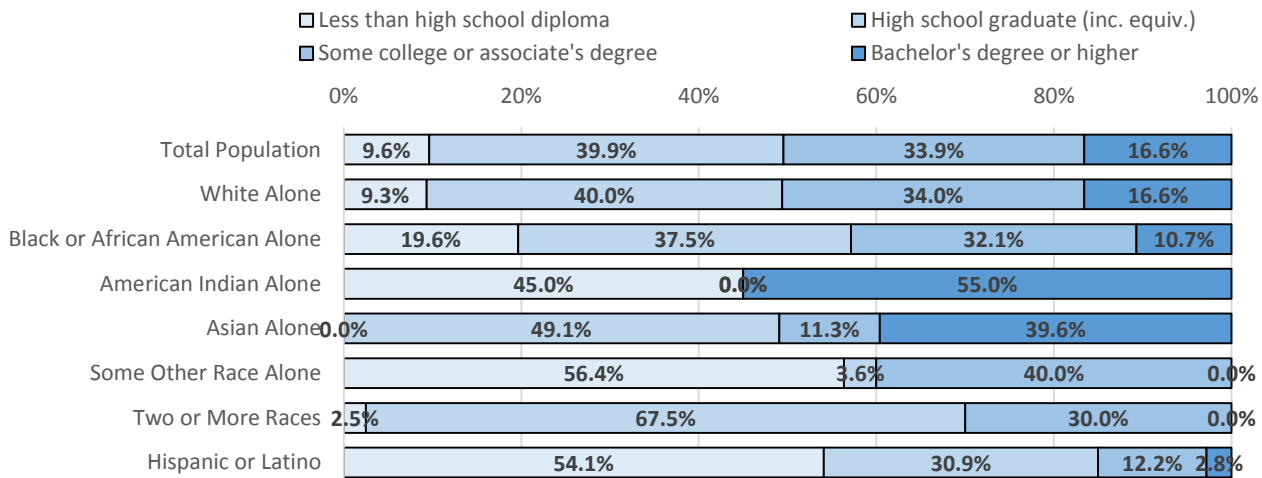

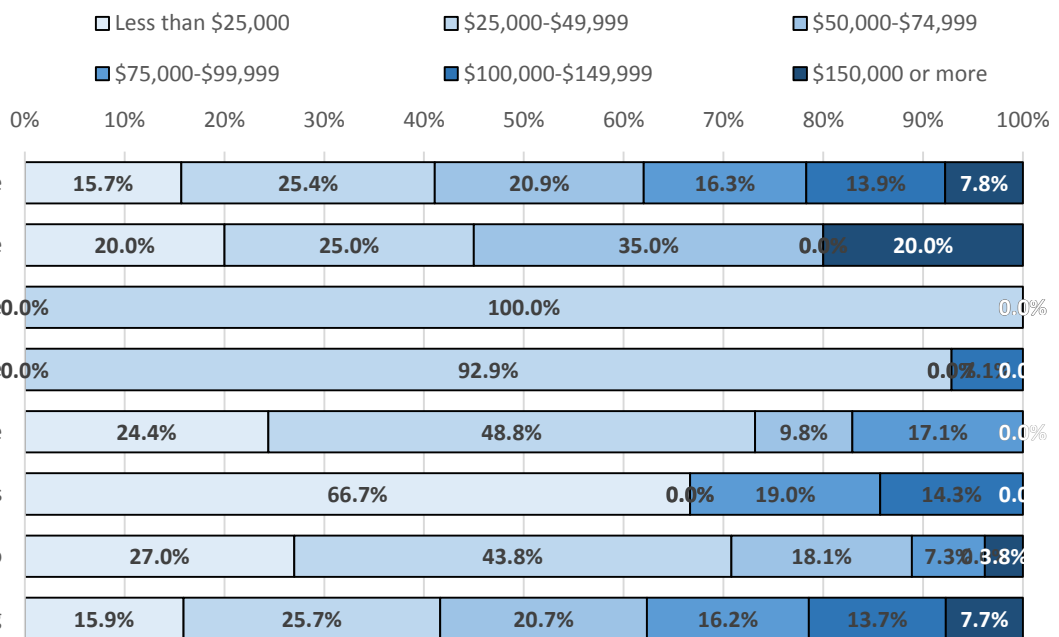

Figure 13. Household Incomes by Race, 2017

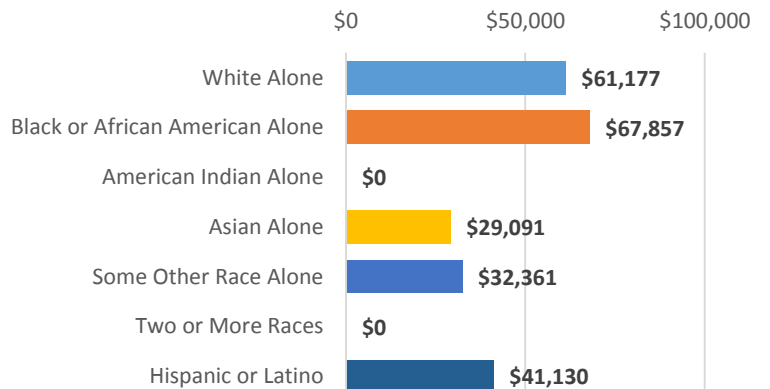

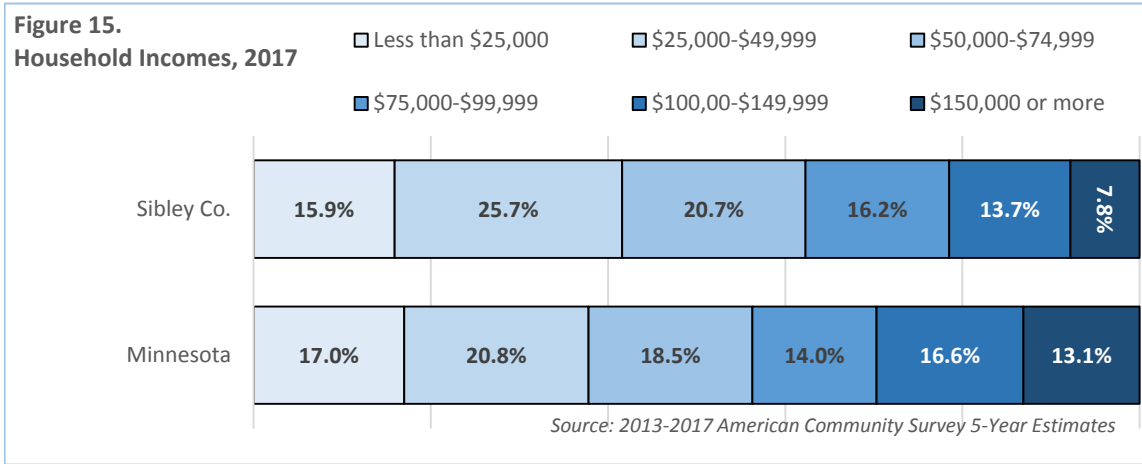

Figure 16. Job Vacancies by Industry, Qtr. 4 2018

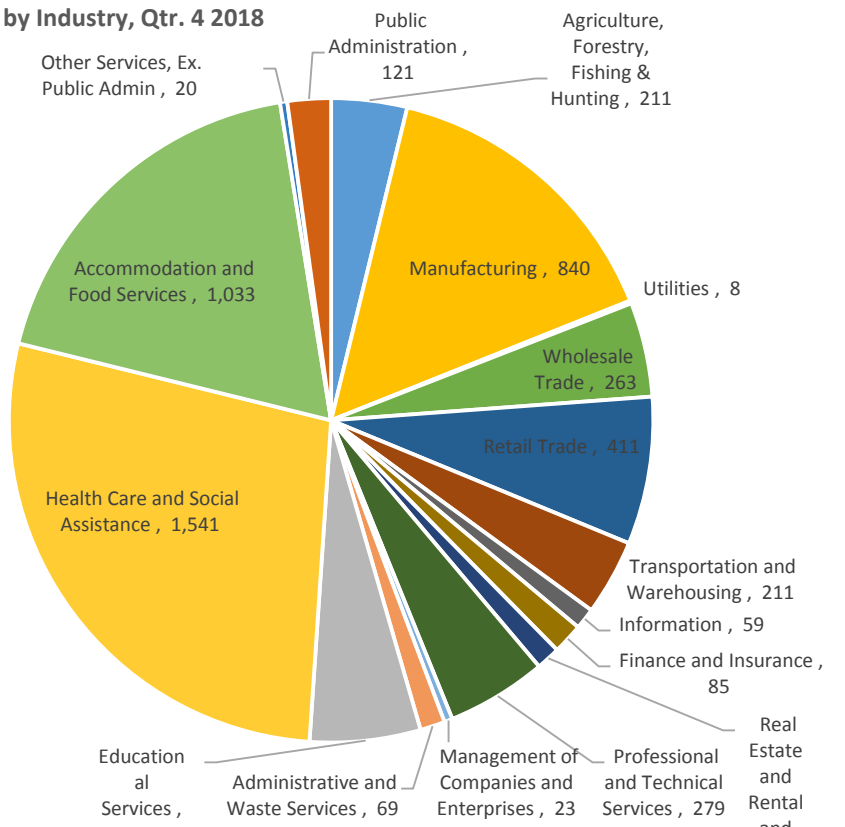
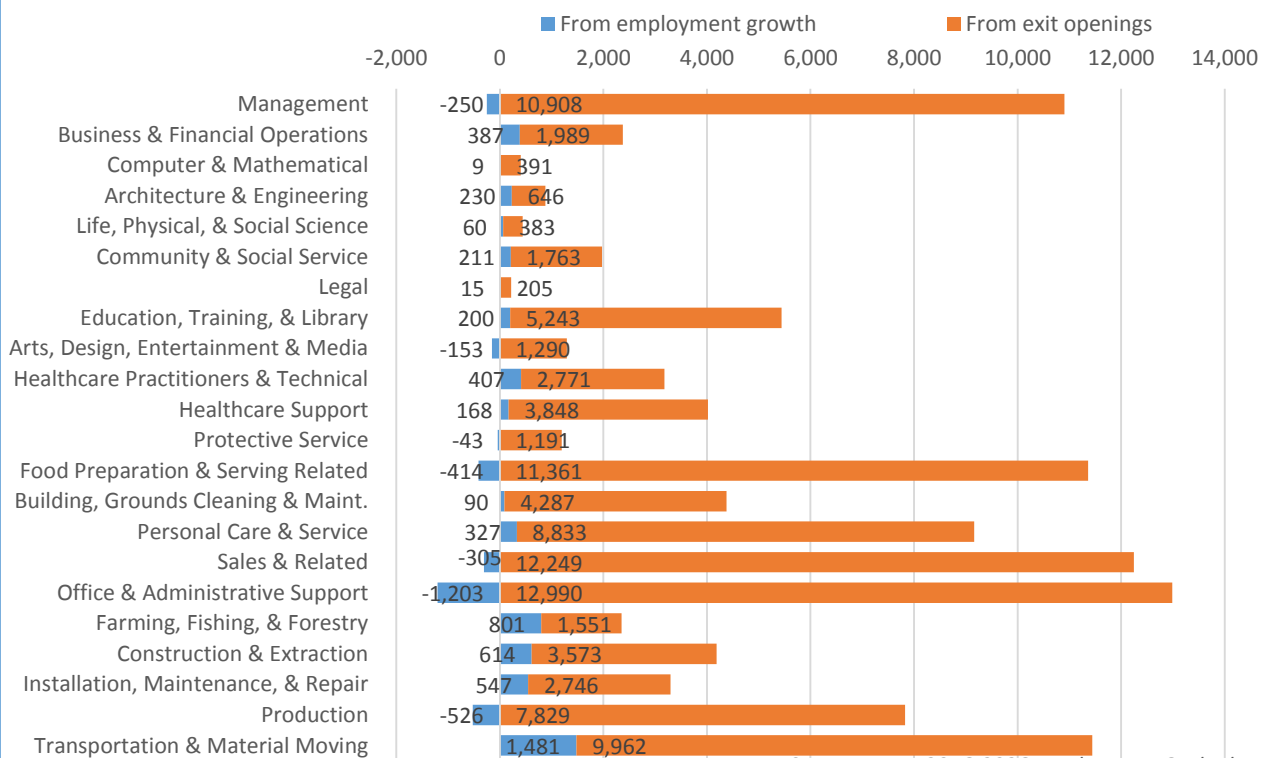

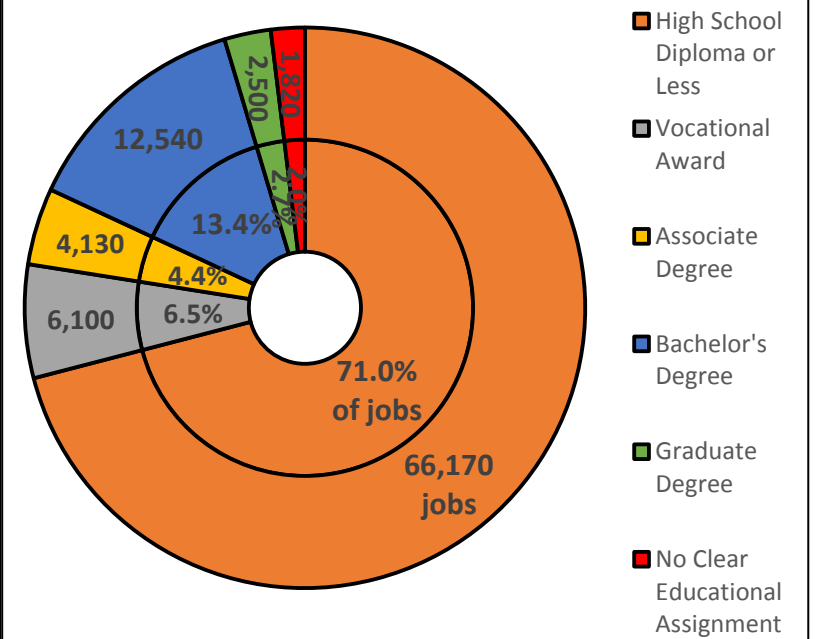

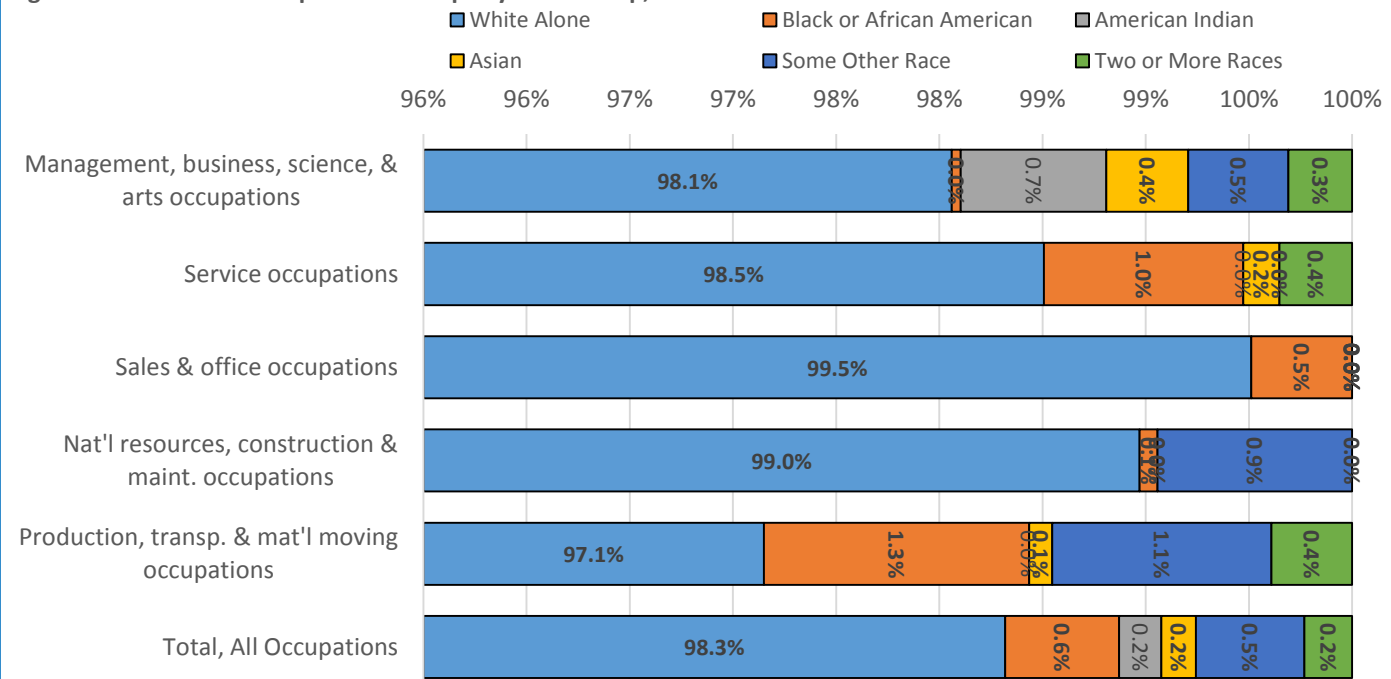

Figure 20. Industry Employment Statistics, 2003-2018

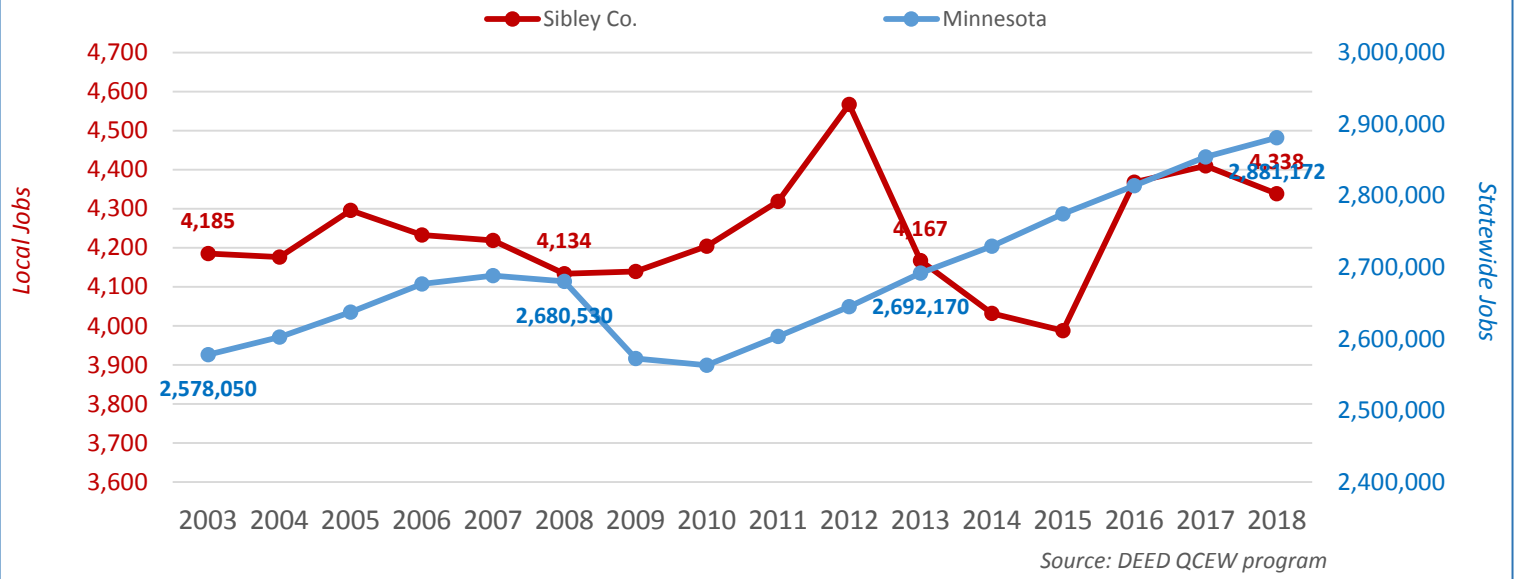

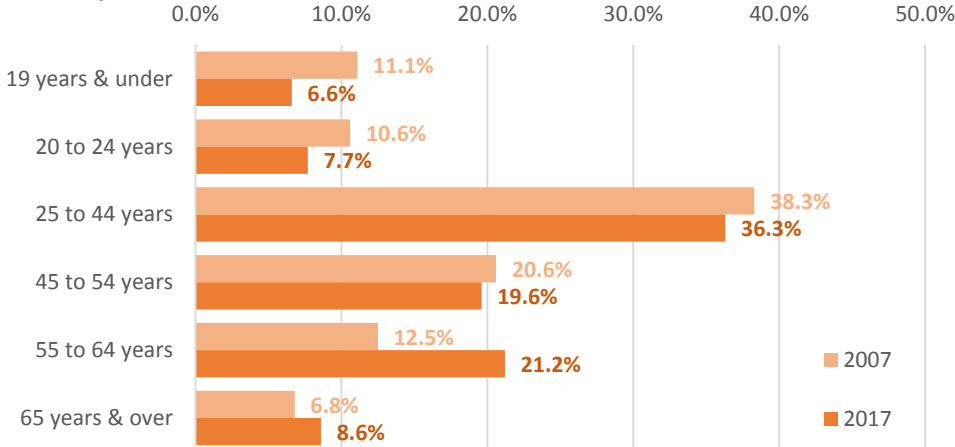

Figure 22. Percentage of Workforce by Gender, Total of All Industries, 2017

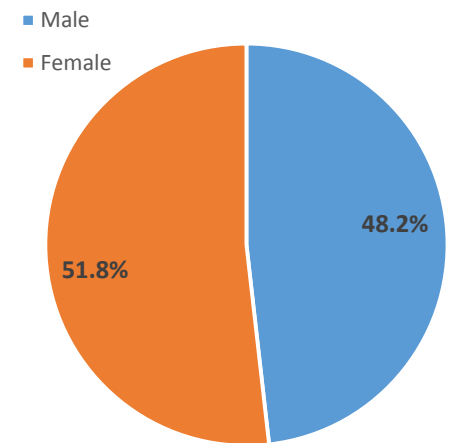
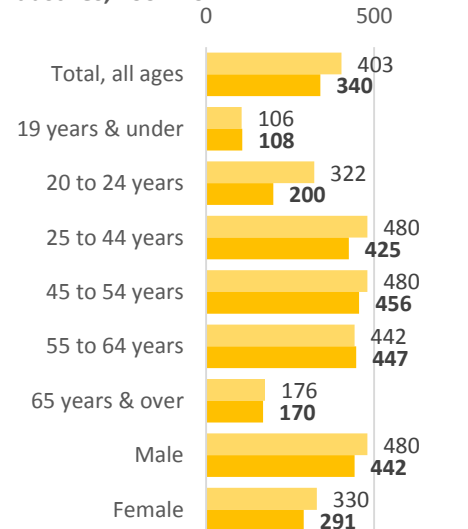


Figure 23. Median Hourly Wage by Age Group and Gender, Total of All Industries, 2007-2017

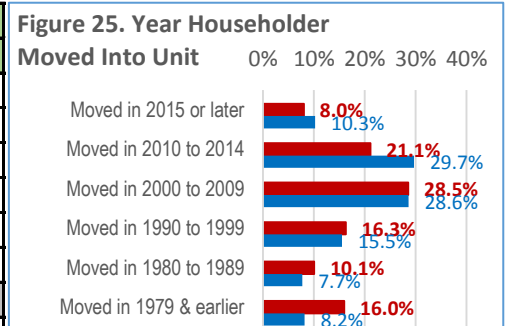

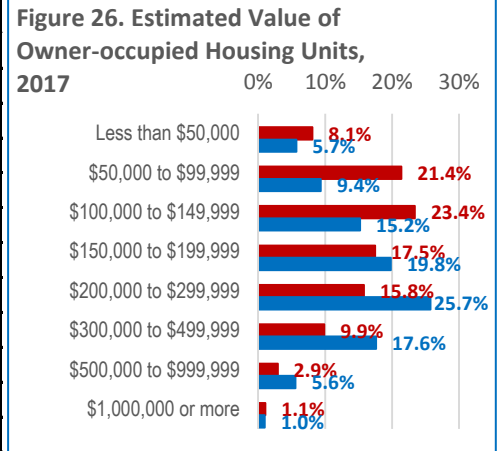


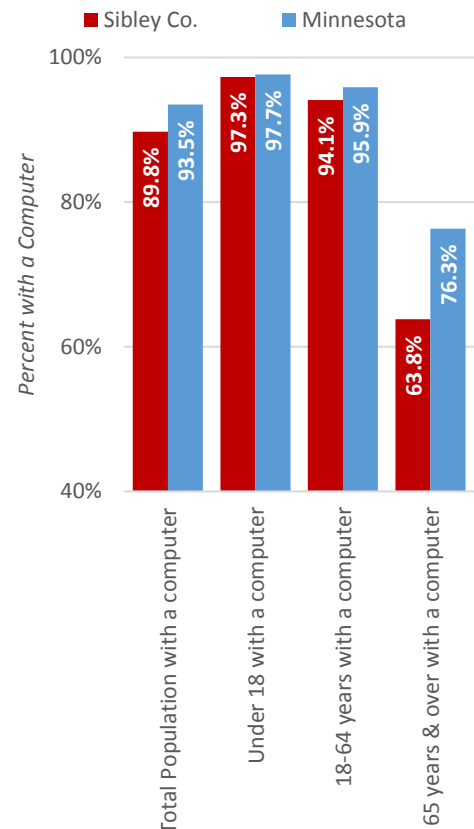
